

RIGHTS AND REPRODUCTIONS PERMISSIONS AND FEES

Placing an order

Images of archival materials and artwork in the collection of the Mattatuck Museum are available for approved uses. All requests for images and permissions must be submitted in writing by letter, fax or on-line application.

Orders should include as much information about the requested image as possible. This helps to expedite your order and ensure that the correct image is provided. Also specify the format in which you wish to receive the image. Please fully describe the purpose(s) for which you will be using the image: e.g. study, in school report, in book text, exhibition catalogue, cover art for a publication, scholarly journal and so forth. Please indicate any deadline and date by which the image is needed, your e-mail and full mailing address.

Contract and Payment

Orders are handled in the order in which they are received. Please allow 4 weeks for delivery of reproductions.

You will receive an e-mail response stating the total fee for your request, based on our Fee Schedule. Permission to reproduce material from the collection must be granted and is at the discretion of the Mattatuck Museum. Images cannot be altered with special permission from the Mattatuck Museum. A contract and invoice will be e-mailed, faxed or posted to you. Prepayment is required. For your convenience, the Museum accepts Mastercard, Visa, Discover, and American Express. You may also pay by check, which should be made payable to the Mattatuck Museum.

Filling Orders

Materials are usually sent within four weeks after receipt of payment and signed contract. If the paperwork and receipt of materials must be completed within two weeks, please let us know so we may expedite the order, which incurs a rush fee at an additional 100% cost; be advised this service is only available to those who supply credit card details at time of order. All other orders wishing to be processed as soon as possible are strongly encouraged to provide credit card details. Available Images

Although a significant portion of the Museum's collections have been photographed, images for some works are not readily available. In such instances, you will be notified and given the option to request new photography for an additional fee. New photography usually requires six to eight weeks to complete and prepayment is required.

Conditions Governing Permission for Reproduction

Access to and use of the Mattatuck Museum's image files and data is subject to the following terms and conditions:

The Mattatuck Museum retains all rights, including copyright, in data, image, and text.

1. Permission is granted for one-time use only in one publication, one edition, and in one language, unless otherwise specified. Additional language editions and subsequent revised new editions will be considered upon application. Photographic materials must be obtained directly through the Mattatuck Museum and may not be reused without written permission.
2. The complete credit line as specified must appear on the same page as the reproduction, on the opposite page, or on the reverse. If the Mattatuck Museum's reproduction(s) are the only one(s) in this publication, providing the full information in one of the above-stated locations, you may then list only the artist's name, title of work, and date; however, the complete documentation must appear elsewhere within the book. In the case of film or video, visual credits must appear at the beginning or the end.
3. The image(s) may not be cropped, bled, or over-printed, and nothing may be superimposed on the reproduction(s), without prior approval. Use of a detail must be approved in advance by the Mattatuck Museum, and the word "detail" must appear in the caption. Reproductions must be full-tone, black and white or full color.
4. The Mattatuck Museum is to receive two gratis copies of the publication sent to the attention of the Curatorial Office, Rights and Reproductions.
5. Certain works of art and photographs of certain works of art, may be protected by copyright, trademark, or related interests not owned by the Mattatuck Museum. In the case of works by living artists and/or subject to the 1976 Copyright Act, the Mattatuck Museum can grant the permission requested only to the extent of its ownership of the rights relating to the request. The responsibility for ascertaining whether any other rights exist, and for obtaining all other necessary written permissions, remains with the applicant. The Mattatuck Museum assumes no responsibility for royalties or fees claimed by the artist or other third parties.
6. Image(s) reproduced on an internet Web site must not be reproduced at higher than 72 DPI. The complete identification and credit line as specified for the image(s) will be placed in close proximity to the image. If the image is printable, the complete credit line as specified will appear in any printout of the image(s). If the reproduction of the image(s) on the Web site is associated with an exhibition, the use of the image will correspond with the duration of the exhibition; extensions may be granted upon separate application.
